

# 2025 VOTER INFORMATION

## ELECTION DAY IS TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 4, 2025.

- Ballots will be mailed to registered voters on Tuesday, October 14, 2025.
- For statewide voter information visit, [vote.utah.gov](https://vote.utah.gov).
- For Election Day and early voting locations, times, and any changes, visit [summitcountyutah.gov/elections](https://summitcountyutah.gov/elections).
- Complete and return ballots to a Drop Box Location (listed on back) before 8 p.m. on November 4, 2025.
- **Mailed ballots must be received by the Clerk's Office by 8 p.m. on Election Day.** In the past, ballots had to be postmarked by Election Day. Voters should be aware of the shorter timeline to return their ballots.
- Polls will be open on Election Day from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. for in-person voting.

### Argument AGAINST the proposed ballot question

As a resident and property owner in the proposed West Hills Incorporation, I urge you to VOTE “NO” on this ballot question.

If passed, this new “town” will have a significant, irreversible impact on the incorporated area (as well as the surrounding Kamas Valley).

The incorporation sponsor has not presented any kind of development plan to voters, demonstrating how it will become a viable municipality, or how it will change from our current rural status.

If this new “town” is actually created, you can expect:

An INCREASE IN YOUR TAXES (footing the bill for infrastructure and development).

FREE REIN FOR DEVELOPMENT. The feasibility study seems to suggest West Hills will accomplish its growth targets by including high density apartments and housing, commercial real estate development, strip malls, and more. Removing existing zoning restrictions.

OVERBURDENED ESSENTIAL SERVICES AND INFRASTRUCTURE. There is no reasonable planning in the proposed incorporation for how this “town” will support itself with access to water, sewer, electrical, roads, let alone emergency services like firefighters and police, or schools for our children.

And with all of this you can expect an end to the rural character and life-style of the Kamas Valley that has existed here for generations.

It took fewer than a dozen people to get this on the ballot — don’t let a small group of individuals change the Kamas Valley forever.

Vote “NO” on the West Hills Incorporation and help preserve the Kamas Valley for the future.

### REBUTTAL to argument AGAINST the proposed ballot question

Arguments against incorporation rely mostly on fear of steep tax hikes. But a third-party feasibility study shared by the town sponsor shows otherwise: a modest initial tax increase in year one to fund essential infrastructure, followed by then matching the county’s tax rate which would sustain town operations per the study.

As for “permanent changes to the valley,” Summit County is already preserving land

using 2021 voter-approved funds, ensuring open space remains protected even with growth.

Fears around development and zoning are overstated. Developers are expected to fund their own projects without burdening residents. Zoning updates are necessary as population grows. The idea of one home per 80 acres is unrealistic and short sighted.

Kamas denied our annexation request, leaving property owners with few options. Incorporation is the only clear path to much needed critical infrastructure improvements.

Currently, we lack paved roads and consistent snow removal, potentially putting lives at risk when emergency vehicles can’t reach homes.

Though my physical address says “Kamas,” I have no vote in its Leadership. To me, being told we are simply “part of South Summit County,” violates the core American principle of representation. Incorporation gives us the opportunity to have representation.

Lastly, the “vote NO” campaign is heavily backed by outside politicians and developers. That interference should concern all of us. Incorporation keeps decision-making local. No one will be forced into unwanted changes, but we all deserve a say.

My fellow property owners, review the facts and vote YES for West Hills.
